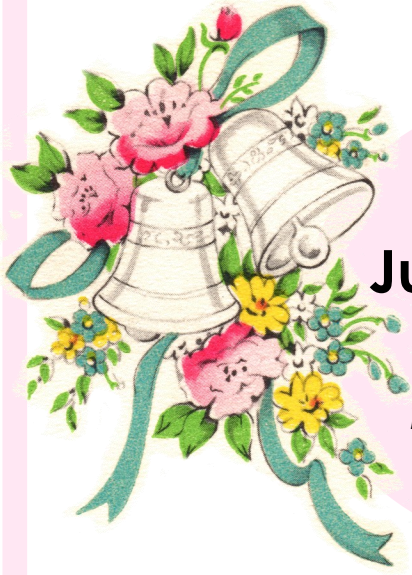


Something Old, Something New: Connecticut Weddings Through the Ages
